New York:

Important Farmland of New York, Preliminary Land Use Guide Map, 1977.

State of New York Office of Planning Coordination. The Guide Map of 1990 Projected Land Uses shows four classes of land considered viable for agriculture: exceptional, high, medium and low, the first three of which are shown on the Map of Farming at right. The classes are defined by current agricultural use (1969) and by the potential for agriculture. It does not differentiate horticultural (fruit, vegetable and vineyard) land from other agricultural land.

New Jersey:

New Jersey State Development and Redevelopment Plan, 1993.

The map is based on 1986 air photo analyses, confirmed by counties and municipalities, and depicts lands classified as agricultural. It does not differentiate between levels of agricultural viability nor does it differentiate between types of production.
